## Background

- Applications were due May 1, 2023
- 45 Applications were received
  - 21 agencies reapplied for continued funding
  - 24 new agencies applied for funding

Total funding requested was \$792,500

Total funding available \$280,000



#### Subcommittee Established Funding Range

- The subcommittee established a \$10,000 minimum and \$20,000 maximum funding per agency
- A \$5,000 funding limit is being recommended for Watsonville Band per their request, and two agencies (Youth Recovery Connections and Watsonville Jr. Wildcatz) to allow these organizations to build capacity in serving the Watsonville community as a first-time grantees
- Funding recommendations also include an increased funding capacity to support community special events which helps various non-profit agencies cover the fees and costs associated with hosting special events that benefit the community at large. Two funding cycles will be available in the year and funding support will increase from \$5,000 up to \$10,000 per event.

### **Application Review Process**

- Do the program/services align with the City Council Strategic Plan priorities?
- Does the program/service meet a current community need?
- Is the organization in good standing with the City and State (if previously funded)? Is the application complete?
- Does the organization serve the Watsonville community? Impact on Watsonville residents.
- Financial need as demonstrated by the organization's overall funding request and annual budget.
