## DEVELOPMENT & FUNDING

Ecology Action has collaborated with the City to submit Caltrans Sustainable Planning grants, Active Transportation (ATP) grants and a Safe Streets for All (SS4A) grant. Our decades plus partnership has allowed us to help the City secure needed planning and active transportation implementation funding.

- ✓ Won 2017 Caltrans Planning Grant for Complete Streets to School Plan \$363K
- ✓ Won 2020 ATP Cycle 5 Safer Access to Pajaro Valley High \$11.7M
- ✓ Won 2022 ATP Cycle 6 Safe Routes to Watsonville \$6.9M
- ✓ Won 2022 Safe Streets 4 All Cycle 1 Vision Zero Plan Update \$ 100K
- ✓ Won 2023 Office of Traffic Safety award with City Police Department \$35K
- Submitted 2023 Caltrans Planning Grant for Vision Zero Corridor Study \$398K



### TRANSPORTATION PLANNING



Ecology Action works closely with city staff to improve bike and pedestrian infrastructure.

#### **Complete Streets to Schools Plan**

- Completed in 2020
- Covers 15 public K-12 schools
- Led to three grant awards totaling \$21 million

#### Vision Zero Corridors Plan

- Application submitted in 2023
- Awards announced this summer
- Will develop design plans to improve safety on one high-collision corridor in Watsonville

## **Pedestrian Safety Education**

#### Program Outcomes for 2022

- ATP C5 Harkins Slough 21-25, Measure D Watsonville, and OTS Watsonville PD
- 8 schools in Watsonville
  - Radcliff, Mintie White, Ann Solo, Landmark, Freedom, HA Hyde, Starlight, Linscott Charter
- **570** 2<sup>nd</sup> grade students
- 27 classes
  - 10 Spanish + 17 English instruction
- 100% of teachers said the program will increase safe walking.
- 15 community events
  - Educating 939 adults and seniors in the community

## **Bike Safety Education**

• ATP C5 Harkins Slough 21-25, Measure D Watsonville, and OTS Watsonville PD

#### • 10 schools

 Radcliff, Mintie White, Ann Solo, Landmark, Freedom, HA Hyde, Starlight, Linscott Charter, Rolling Hills Middle School, Cesar Chavez Middle School

#### • 35 classes

- 24 5<sup>th</sup> grade classes + 11 middle school classes
- **1,258** students
- Taught 72 students to ride a bike for the first time.

## 2022 Outcomes for Spring and Fall events

- 1,357 students participated in Walk and Roll to School Day in PVUSD.
- 11 schools participated
- On average 14% of the student body participated in the event.
- **710** miles traveled using active modes of transportation to school
- Hosting **1** Family Fun Festival per year

## What is Coming

ATP C6 23-27

- Pedestrian and Bike Safety Education
  - Programming to all 2nd and 5th graders for 4 years at Watsonville schools including, MacQuiddy, Ann Soldo, Calabasas, Radcliff, Linscott Charter and Mintie White.
- Robust Community Engagement
  - E-bikes demonstrations
  - Bike Mechanic workshop
  - Community bike rides
  - Love to Ride challenge

#### • Traffic Gardens

• 3 permanent courses (traffic gardens) to be installed at schools and a park so that children and community members can safely practice biking on a protected space
