

RESOLUTION NO. _____ (CM)

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WATSONVILLE ESTABLISHING A COMMERCIAL CONTAINER CONTAMINATION FEE FOR THE PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT

WHEREAS, notice of the time and place of the hearing to consider approval of the Commercial Container Contamination was given at the time and in the manner pursuant to California Government Code Section 6062a: and

WHEREAS, a public hearing was held according to California Government Code Section 66018.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WATSONVILLE, AS FOLLOWS:

1. This action does not meet CEQA’s definition of a “project”, because the action does not have the potential for resulting in either a direct physical change in the environment or a reasonably foreseeable indirect physical change in the environment.

2. The City Council hereby establishes and sets the Commercial Container Contamination Fee, as listed in Exhibit “A”, attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference. SB 1383 and Chapter 10 (Mandatory Organic Waste Disposal Reduction) of Title 6 (Sanitation and Health) of the Watsonville Municipal Code requires the separation of trash, recycling and organics in carts and containers and provides compliance and enforcement.

3. That the herein fee, rates, and charges effective July 1, 2024, shall henceforth be adjusted annually by the rate of the April-to-April change in the Consumer Price Index (CPI) for all Urban Consumer San Francisco-Oakland-San Jose, California. Changes shall be effective July 1 of each year.
