Lifetime Achievement July 27, 2024

- WHEREAS, Nita Gizdich has a long history in the Pajaro Valley at the Gizdich Ranch which was originally purchased by her father-in-law Vincent John Gizdich, a Croatian immigrant, in 1934 for \$1,400, after which the family moved their three sons from Oakland to the beautiful Pajaro Valley; and
- WHEREAS, back in 1934, the ranch consisted of five acres of apples and five acres of land for pigs and chickens, and the family home had no electricity or indoor bathrooms but did have a much-needed packing shed; and
- WHEREAS, of the three brothers, Nita's husband, Vince Jr., was the only one interested in farming for a living; and
- WHEREAS, Vince and Nita met at a Croatian social dance club, became dance partners, and quickly developed what would become a lifetime love; and
- WHEREAS. at the young age of 16, Vince was eager to buy Nita an engagement ring, but Nita was steadfast on first graduating high school, which she did on a Friday and then married Vince the following Sunday; and
- WHEREAS, when Vincent Sr. retired, Nita and Vince moved to the ranch to run the family business, with their two sons having been born just before that; and
- WHEREAS, Vince soon suggested that Nita start selling her wonderful pies, which proved to be a successful decision and resulted in a lifetime of recognition for their pies; and
- WHEREAS. with a staunch dedication to the people and organizations in the Pajaro Valley, Nita has volunteered countless hours and served on the board of directors for many of these organizations; and
- WHEREAS, now in semi-retirement, Nita can be found welcoming visitors to Gizdich Ranch, which has been a Pajaro Valley pioneer for agri-tourism and showing visitors how their food is grown, on an almost daily basis; and
