CANNABIS ORDINANCE MODIFICATIONS

WMC CHAPTERS 14-53 (CANNABIS FACILITIES)
AND 14-16 (DISTRICT REGULATIONS)



- In 2016 Ordinance 1345-16 created the Cannabis Ordinance
- In 2020, Ordinance 1404-20 and 1406-20 amended the Cannabis Ordinance
- In 2023, given the challenging regulatory and economic environment facing cannabis businesses, staff reached out to local cannabis businesses to understand their concerns regarding the existing cannabis ordinance and their recommended modifications
- On October 10, 2023, CDD Director presented a study session on potential modifications to the Cannabis Ordinance to the City Council

- Sixteen potential modifications were presented to City Council:
 - I. Add Another Retail License
 - 2. Consider Another Commercial Zoning District for Retail
 - 3. Consider Waivers to Distance Requirements
 - 4. Change Signage Regulations
 - 5. Modify Annual Renewal Process
 - 6. Modify Owner Definition
 - 7. ID Badges for Owners Only
 - 8. Rolling Application Period for Non-Retail

- 9. Increase Hours
- 10. On-Site 24-Hour Security Requirement
- 11. Flavored Vaporizers
- 12. Decriminalization of Psychoactive Drugs
- 13. Drive-In Retail Service
- 14. Allow Hoophouses for Nursery Plants
- 15. Cannabis Events with On-Site Consumption
- 16. Background Checks for Owners Only

- At the October 10, 2023, study session, City Council expressed interest in several of the proposed modifications. Following the meeting, City Staff conducted additional analysis on:
 - I. Amending Signage Requirements to Match Commercial Sign Standards
 - 2. Streamlining Annual Renewal Process
 - 3. Removing City-Issued ID Badge Requirement
 - 4. Allowing Open Application Period for Non-Retail Permits
 - 5. Increasing Allowable Operating Hours
 - 6. Permitting Cannabis Retail in Additional Commercial Zoning Districts
 - 7. Amending Separation Requirements to Match State Requirements
 - 8. Limiting 24-hour On-Site Security Requirements
 - 9. Limiting Background Checks to Business Owners Only, Add Definition of 'Owner'

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

- After additional analysis of the proposed modifications, City Staff met with the following community prevention partners to review the Staff recommendations:
 - Pajaro Valley Prevention and Student Assistance
 - Santa Cruz County Prevention Partners
- The City addressed the prevention partners concerns with a letter Dated April 3, 2024.
- The City also met with the Cannabis Business Owners throughout the Cannabis Ordinance update process.


- On May 7, 2024, City Staff presented findings and recommendations on the City Council-identified modifications to the Planning Commission.
- Planning Commission unanimously approved staff recommendations for amending the Cannabis Ordinance

- The state guidelines for separation is as follows Business and Professions code Section 25054:
 - A premise licensed under this division shall not be located within a 600-foot radius of a school providing instruction in kindergarten or any grades K through 12, day care center, or youth center that is in existence at the time the license is issued, unless the department or a local jurisdiction specifies a different radius.



 - IP
 - IG
 - CV
- Amend to allow in the following zones:
 - CT
 - CV
 - CNS
 - CN

AMEND THE CANNABIS SIGN ORDINANCE WMC 14-53.401

- The Cannabis Ordinance restricts cannabis retail signage to one 20 SF sign and one green cross.
- Regional Analysis:
 - Capitola
 - Santa Cruz
 - Salinas
 - County of Santa Cruz
- Staff Recommendation:
 - Regulate cannabis signage under WMC Chapter 14-21 – Signs

Chapter 14-21 Signs


Zoning District	Area per linear foot of building frontage
IG, IP, CT, CV, CNS, CN, and CO	2 FT per linear foot – 300 SF max

- Sign Types
 - Awning signs
 - Monument signs
 - Wall signs
 - Directory signs
- Adjustment to sign standards
 - Low visibility commercial properties

MODIFY THE ANNUAL RENEWAL PROCESS WMC 14-53.114

- The City will remove the following submittal requirements:
 - A copy of the recorded deed vesting ownership of the parcel in the current owner.
 - Requirement to submit LiveScan background checks.
 - Requirement to submit security plan.
 - Vehicle registration and proof of insurance for all delivery vehicles.

MODIFY THE REQUIREMENT FOR ANNUAL ID BADGES WMC 14-53.406

- ID badges are required for every owner, manager and employee
- Badges must be renewed annually
- The amended Ordinance will eliminate the requirement of annual ID badges



- The Ordinance does not allow ongoing application submittal for available non-retail licenses
 - Processing, manufacturing, non-storefront delivery, distribution
- The amended Ordinance would allow an unrestricted application period for non-retail cannabis permits.

REMOVE 24 HOURS ON-SITE SECURITY REQUIREMENTS FOR RETAIL WMC 14-53.404(13)



- 24-hour on-site security guards or alternative security such as actively managed video surveillance are required for retail businesses
- Amendment would limit 24-hour onsite security guard requirements to hours of operation and hours when employees are on-site with actively managed video surveillance afterhours

LIMIT BACKGROUND CHECKS WMC 14-53.110

- Background checks are required for all owners and managers of the business
- Amendment would limit background checks to owners only

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Planning Commission recommends that the City Council adopt a Resolution recommending the City Council amend Chapters 14-16 (District Regulations) and 14-53 (Cannabis Facilities) of the Watsonville Municipal Code regarding cannabis facilities.
