What does solving this homeless problem in OUR community mean to you?

- 1. Affordable and Low-Barrier Housing: Focus on creating more long-term, affordable housing options for unhoused individuals with fewer barriers to entry.
- 2. Dignity and Respect: Treating the unhoused with dignity and respect while providing them with opportunities to transition into stable housing.
- **3. Comprehensive Support Services:** Offering mental health services, drug addiction treatment, and support services as a first step toward housing stability.
- **4. Community Well-Being:** Building a healthy, inclusive, and safe environment for all, including prioritizing farmworkers and vulnerable populations.
- **5. Collaboration and Coordination:** Encouraging more cooperation between local organizations and nonprofits to address homelessness effectively.
- **6. Compassionate Engagement:** Fostering empathy and building systems that prioritize compassionate, long-term solutions over punitive measures.
- **7. Equity and Prevention:** Ensuring equitable distribution of resources, focusing on prevention, and advocating for policies that reduce homelessness at the systemic level.
- **8. Safe, Designated Spaces:** Establishing designated areas with necessary facilities (like toilets and showers) for unhoused individuals, while considering the needs of homeowners and other community members.
- 9. Awareness and Education: Raising public awareness through education on best practices for solving homelessness and promoting empathy.
- **10. Holistic Approach:** Creating a safer community through a comprehensive plan addressing root causes, prevention, and recovery, while balancing the needs of all residents.


