SUBJECT:	SEXUAL ASSAULT NURSE EXAMINER'S PROGRAM REVENUE CONTRIBUTION
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	AMENDMENT TO AGREEMENT

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends that the City Council adopt a resolution approving the Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner's Program Revenue Contribution Amendment to Agreement in the amount of \$103,545 for FY 25-26, authorizing and directing the City Manager to execute the same and any necessary documents.

BACKGROUND:

Since 2001, the City of Watsonville has been part of a multi-jurisdictional cooperative effort involving local area hospitals and local law enforcement agencies concerned with assisting victims of sexual assault. The contributing entities include the City of Watsonville, City of Santa Cruz, City of Scotts Valley, City of Capitola, County of Santa Cruz and the University of California at Santa Cruz; these entities want to ensure the continuation of an organized, effective team response to cases of adult and child sexual assault in Santa Cruz County through the continuity of the Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner's (SANE) Program.

DISCUSSION:

The City of Watsonville has been a participating entity in the Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner's Program Revenue Contributing Agreement since 2001. The Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner (SANE) program is a multidisciplinary response intervention that aims to improve care for victims, through specialized coordinated services. As opposed to emergency department physicals caring for sexual assault victims, specially trained SANE nurses provide comprehensive psychological, medical, and forensic services to the victims. The goal of the program is to provide safe and privacy-conscious treatment to recent sexual assault victims in a response that coordinates health care with counseling services, forensic collection, law enforcement, and prosecution.

This amendment to agreement allows the Watsonville Police Department to be part of a multi-jurisdictional cooperative that ensures that sexual assault evidence is gathered according to established medical and legal standards. All participating entities agree that the best results for examinations of sexual assault victims are achieved through cooperative efforts. Overall the SANE program strives to minimize the victim's physical and psychological trauma, while maximizing the probability of evidence collection and preserving physical evidence for use in the legal system, if necessary.

CALIFORNIA ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ACT (CEQA) DETERMINATION:

Approval of this agreement is not a project pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) because it can be seen with certainty based on substantial evidence in the record that the approval constitutes a government fiscal activity that does not involve any commitment to any specific project that may result in a potentially significant physical impact on the environment. (CEQA Guidelines section 15378(b)(4).

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

The contribution is based on 19.4% of the County population, for FY 25-26, the City of Watsonville contribution will be \$103,545; an increase of \$22,024 compared to this fiscal year. The Watsonville Police Department will be requesting a general fund (150-409-7369) increase in this amount during FY 25-26 in order to be able to sustain this agreement.
