**WHEREAS,** Fiestas Patrias de Watsonville was founded in 1990 after the devastating Loma Prieta earthquake of 1989 as an effort by community leaders, businesses, organizations, and residents to bring life and community back to the downtown area; and

- WHEREAS, Fiestas Patrias was established and sponsored by non-profit La Alianza del Valle Pajaro, an organization founded to support cannery workers; and
- WHEREAS, the first fiestas, commemorating cinco de mayo and dieciséis de septiembre, were held on Peck Street, with volunteers raising funds to pay small amounts to bands, mariachi groups, and folkloric dancers; and
- **WHEREAS,** festivals were held on Sundays to make them more accessible to farm workers, and free to all members of the public; and
- WHEREAS, festival organizers wanted to create safe, family-oriented events, deciding to keep them alcohol and tobacco free, which is still the case today; and
- **WHEREAS,** as the festivals grew in popularity, downtown businesses began ordering additional supplies in anticipation of the festivals and churches, non-profits and small vendors looked forward to fundraising through food booths and arts and crafts sales; and
- WHEREAS, the City of Watsonville offered its support through its Parks & Community Services, Public Works & Utilities, Police, and Fire Departments; and
- WHEREAS, the festivals moved to Main Street and now feature well-known banda groups, local mariachis, folkloric dance troupes, and youth and Aztec dancers; and
- WHEREAS, attending the festivals of Fiestas Patrias has become a Sunday tradition for many families who for six hours enjoy music, dancing, browsing vendors and stores, and obtaining information on important current issues.

**NOW, THEREFORE,** I, Maria Orozco, Mayor of the City of Watsonville, in the State of California, on behalf of the City Council hereby recognize Fiestas Patrias de Watsonville for over three decades of bringing residents together in a celebration of culture, history, and community.
