## Open Letter to the Watsonville City Council Regarding the Importance of Budgeting For Our Values and the Next Generation through the Budget

#### To our elected representatives,

Your constituents across the city of Watsonville are asking the City Council to make budgetary decisions that are bold, innovative, and reflective of the community's needs, wants and values: a budget that prioritizes economic recovery from COVID-19, culturally relevant supports for community based activities, robust health supports, and building an economically vibrant Watsonville. Our community has had to face the harsh reality of policing and systemic racism, a toxic relationship that has an adverse effect on our city's residents.

As such, we implore you to re-analyze the city's budget allocations and funding priorities with a community healing centered lens that is racially equitable. Poverty, trauma, and racism in our community continue to be exacerbated by unaddressed root causes. Yet, we remain hopeful that the city council believes in dignity and our right to thrive with community centered solutions; as

such we demand that the city reallocate the police budget and not overlook the deterioration of our most marginalized communities nor let the lessons of 2020 be forgotten. This is why we urge you to take a second, third and fourth look prior to the budget vote that will take place on June 22, 2021.

The City of Watsonville's biennial proposed plan for fiscal years 2021-2022 and 2022-2023 general fund continues to reflect the ineffective way of doing work by continuing to provide 40%<sup>1</sup> of the budget towards the Police Department while under-funding our libraries with only 1% of the budget, and 10% to parks and recreation, community engagement and communication.

Although latest data from the Census show that 32.46%<sup>2</sup> of the population in Watsonville are under the age of 19, there are not sufficient employment, recreational, social, or healing opportunities available within the city. The need for holistic youth development, engagement, and employment are critical to the well-being of our community, and yet are not being prioritized by the currently proposed budget. These services and opportunities would give space to our young community members to more fully engage in and lay deep, lasting roots within our community.

According to the US Census Bureau, the total population is 54,000 and 84.33% of the population in Watsonville identify as Chicano, Latinx, and Indigenous. Historically, these minoritized communities have not been included in the decision making process when it comes to our city. The city has engaged residents through various strategic planning efforts in the last year to gather input and the residents have shown up and spoken up to demand a city budget that is invested in seeing its residents thrive in all aspects of life.

As the City of Watsonville prepares to reopen, we have yet to understand the lasting impacts caused by COVID-19 on our community's social-emotional well-being. Moreover, we recognize that the city council acted quickly and established a moratorium on evictions as the pandemic picked up, and created different opportunities for resident engagement in the city's budget and strategic planning process. While this is a step in the right direction, there is more that the city can do to ensure the economic revitalization of and for the residents that have been historically forgotten and silenced.

Despite our consistent calls to action, the proposed budget reinforces the long standing "toughon-crime" status quo and underlying quid pro quos that results in nearly half of the city budget
going to police (with a pending 8% increase). This runs in conflict with the downward trends in
overall crime and incarceration which this past year have hit historic lows. These drops in crime
are not a pandemic anomaly - rates of crime across all metrics have been going down for over
a decade, while police budgets have continued to increase and other departments have seen
minimal to no growth in their allocations. The council has refused to recognize that public
safety is more than police; public safety is investing equitably into our community through
programs and services that give opportunity for healing and thriving. Our community deserves
an equitable budget that reflects our communities priorities.

The residents of Watsonville have shared their thoughts with this city council and expressed their desires to see a new approach; hence the residents demand that this city council reallocate the proposed budget augmentation for the police budget towards the following:

- 1. Library General Fund \$500,000
- 2. Parks and Recreation \$2,000,000
  - a. Recreation Centers \$500,000
  - b. Recreation Sports Programs \$500,000
  - c. Art and Science \$500,000
  - d. Cultural Healing and Wellness Supports \$500,000
- 3. Public Works (Street, Sidewalks) \$550,000
- 4. City Media & Communication Strategy \$250,000
- 5. Youth Employment Program to CBO's \$1,000,000

**Total:** \$4,300,000

Reallocating funds would allow other departments to adequately prepare to meet the needs of Watsonville's most vulnerable populations especially those who are elderly, undocumented, formerly incarcerated and system impacted youth. City Council members are elected to represent us all, and we are calling on them to act with courage, and amend the budget.

With open minds and compassionate hearts, we are optimistic that you will choose to prioritize the needs and values of our community. In choosing to invest into the community by reallocating funds, we would begin to approach a community centered budget that would impact and support current and future generations. Now is the time to be bold, innovative, and courageous, and we expect that you will do what is just, equitable, and fair for our community.

Thank you for your time and service representing the people; we look forward to working collaboratively for our future.
