I am in receipt of your email and the letter for extensions attached to it. Although it appears that the request had been submitted on May 27th, 2020, in my previous email to you dated January 27th, 2020, I had indicated to you that only one extension shall be provided for each permit. As I had already provided the extensions for permits BP 2017-156, 157, 158, 159, 161, 163, 164, 165, & 166 that were set to expire on May 28th, 2020 there were no further extensions available.

With regard to BP 2017-144, 155, 160, 162, 169, & 170, I had also stated that these were set to expire on May 11th, 2020. I further stated that failure to request extensions in a timely manner prior to the expiration dates would result in the loss of any option for an extension of these permits. I have again provided a copy of the referenced email at the bottom for your review.

We are unable to continue to provide any extensions on permitted work that does not seem to move forward. Only 2 extensions maximum are allowed by our ordinances as had been shared with you in an earlier email today.

Lorenzo,

Last week you called and informed me that you had made an email request for extensions on the existing permits for Sunshine Gardens back on April 28th, 2020. I am not able to go back in my emails to April 28th, and search for the specific email that you had referenced as all of our older emails are deleted by our I.T. department after 2 months. You are therefore required to submit a copy of that correspondence to me for consideration although this is not an automatic approval without showing justifiable cause as to why these extensions are required. I have included the code section for this procedure below.

Chapter 1

BUILDING AND HOUSING ADMINISTRATIVE CODE*

8-1.105 Permits.

(i) Validity of Permit. The issuance or granting of a permit shall not be construed to be a permit for, or an approval of, any violation of any of the provisions of this code or of any other ordinance of the City. Permits presuming to give authority to violate or cancel the provisions of this code or other ordinances of the City shall not be valid. The issuance of a permit based on construction documents and other data shall not prevent the Building Official from requiring the correction of errors in the construction documents and other data. The Building Official is also authorized to prevent occupancy or use of a structure where in violation of this code or of any other ordinances of the City.

(j) Expiration. Every permit issued shall become invalid unless the work on the site authorized by such permit is commenced within one hundred eighty (180) days after its issuance, or if the work authorized on the site by such permit is suspended or abandoned for a period of one hundred eighty (180) days after the time the work is commenced. The Building Official is authorized to grant, in writing, up to two (2) extensions of time for action by the permittee for a period not exceeding one hundred eighty (180) days each time upon payment of appropriate fees and a written request by the permittee showing that circumstances beyond the control of the permittee have prevented action from being taken.
